CHEATING IN ANTIQUITY



Those who were found cheating were fined and the money was used to erect bronze statues of Zeus on the way to the stadium. The statues were engraved with messages describing the crimes and warning the other contestants against cheating, reminding them that a victory is not won in order to obtain material benefits, emphasizing the Olympic spirit of piety and fairness towards the gods.

CHEATING IN ANTIQUITY



The Romans used the damnatio memoriae system to condemn the memory of despised people. The Egyptians did something similar during the reign of Queen Hatshepsut, and the Greeks commemorated the names of the cheaters so that their example could not be forgotten.

The writer Pausanias, in the Description of Greece, describes these statues, also mentioning some cheaters:

- **Eupolus of Thessaly bribed his 3 opponents at the 98th Olympics;**
- **Callipus of Athens bought his competitors in the pentathlon test during the 182th Olympics;**
- **two Egyptian boxers: Didas and Sarapammon have been fined for rigging the results of some matches at the 226th Olympics.**

OBJECTIVES:



- 1. Creating advertising posters to show the risk faced on one hand by cheating players and on the other by coaches urging players to cheat.**
- 2. Displaying advertising elements at official FIDE competitions and / or at FIDE-approved tournaments**
 - translation into the official languages of FIDE for official competitions;**
 - translation into the language of each member structure (for federations and other member structures);**

DURATION:

- **Continuous**

- **500€ image rights for the young lady on the first poster,**
- **The obligation to indicate on the poster: “This poster was produced in collaboration with the DRAJES Nouvelle-Aquitaine”,**
- **Printing posters according to the expected budget.**
